"LIBÉRER DE LA DROGUE"

The support and reintegration project helps people in need and their families by providing a space for sharing and listening sessions at the Chapelle Bon Pasteur, in Baie du Tombeau. Led by a team of five experienced volunteers, these sessions bring together an average of four participants per week. Since the launch, 27 people and 39 loved ones have been welcomed, with three healings already confirmed. Families testify to a positive change: more serenity, dialogue and participation in daily life. This project embodies a wonderful dynamic of solidarity and hope.

PUBLIC COLLECTION -26 TO 28 DECEMBER 2025

From 26 to 28 December 2025, PWS organized a public collection to support: "5 Pains et deux Poissons": supporting homeless individuals "Bienvenue Pre-Primary School": assisting children in vulnerable situations "Libérer de la drogue": helping people struggling with drug addiction towards a fresh start.

Over these three days, volunteers were present in the streets of Port Louis, as well as at the entrances of Super U Goodlands and Super U Grand Baie, collecting donations. Thanks to the generosity of the public, a total amount of Rs 121,895 was raised.

From this amount, Rs 6,125 was used to cover essential costs such as transport, meals for volunteers, and materials for the collection boxes. A total net of Rs 115,770 has therefore been deposited into the official PWS bank account.

PWS warmly thanks all volunteers and members of the organization for their dedication and support, which made this public fundraising campaign a great success.



PRE-PRIMARY SCHOOL BIENVENUE

Pre-Primary Education Scheme: Free Access Maintained Until 2026

"We would like to reassure parents, the public, and all early childhood stakeholders that nothing will change in the Granting Aid formula until 31 December 2026." These were the words of the Minister of Education, Mahend Gungapersad, who made the announcement alongside members of the Interministerial Committee, composed of several ministers. The Free Pre-Primary Education Scheme will therefore remain in place until 31 December 2026.

As a reminder, the authorities had previously mentioned a revision of the system starting in January 2026. The new model proposed that private pre-primary schools receive a monthly allocation of Rs 2,750 per child, replacing the reimbursement of operational costs with the difference expected to be covered by parents. Under its current framework, the Free Pre-Primary Education Scheme allows many families to benefit from free early childhood education, a measure widely praised for its contribution to the democratization of access to pre-primary learning.

Pre-primary education will remain free until the end of 2026. However, in order to continue providing children with a safe and high-quality learning environment from 2027 onwards, PWS must already begin exploring solutions to support the school. DM/EPM EXCHANGE

As part of the partnership between the Presbyterian Church of Mauritius and DM (Switzerland), the Morvant family has been in Mauritius since December 2025 and will remain there until July 2026. Their main mission is to strengthen ties within the Presbyterian community and actively contribute to parish life.

When we meet the Morvant family, we meet Tsiry, who has been a parish leader for eight years and holds a master's degree in theology; Noémie, who has been a financial audit manager for six years; and their two daughters, Élise and Chloé.

More specifically, they are involved with the children's department, as part of the École Théologique des Laïcs (ETL), as well as within the PWS. They support the PWS department in structuring its projects and vision, improving its visibility, and collaborating with members for better monitoring and evaluation of projects.
